LESSON PLAN FOR EDUCATORS

UNDERSTANDING DONATION & TRANSPLANT

The following lesson plan is designed to be flexible – you can decide how the topic of organ, eye and tissue donation best fits within your curriculum and meets the state mandate of 30 minutes of donation education.

Students will:

- Watch a video about donation provided by Donate Life Minnesota.
- Be provided printed materials that talk about organ, eye and tissue donation and what it means to register as a donor.
- Be encouraged to have a conversation with their parent or guardian about their decision.
