

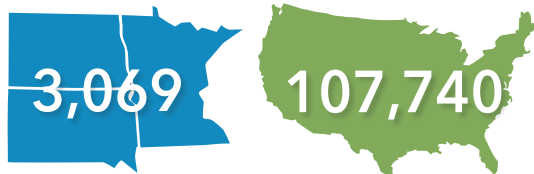

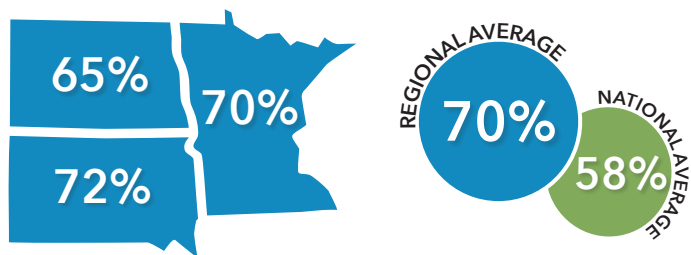

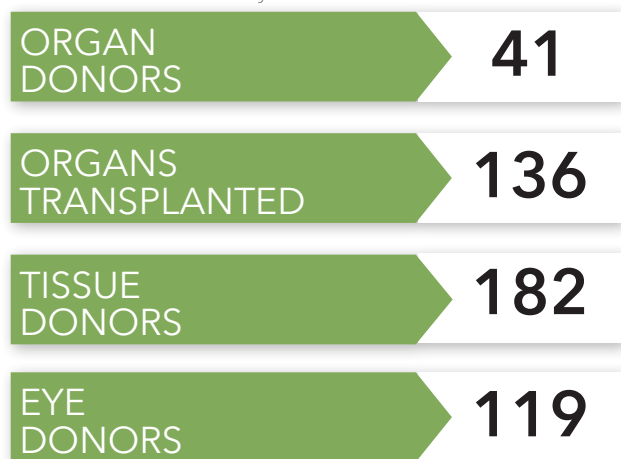
ADULTS REGISTERED AS DONORS

January - March 2021



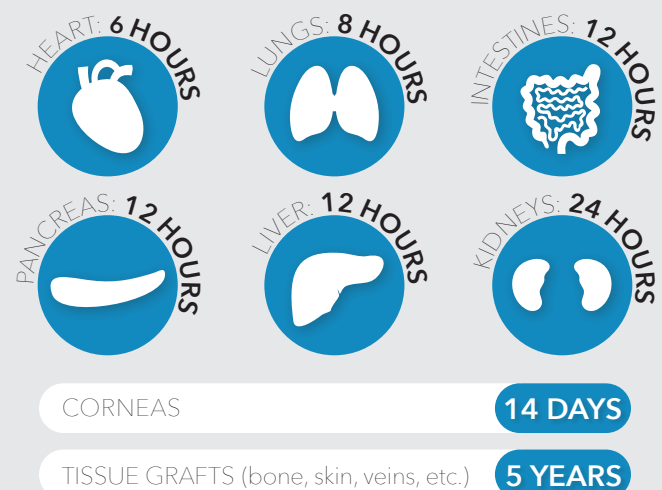
Each day, **22 people** die while waiting for a transplant. A new name is added to the transplant waiting list every **10 minutes**.
